

IMMIGRATION FEES

Our prices and charging for various immigration applications is outlined below. Our prices are based on a fixed fee basis as follows:

Initial Consultation (for any case)*

Cost – Free initial 30 minute consultation thereafter chargeable at the hourly rate of £220 (calculated as applicable for part of the hour if less than 1 hour)

Types of Application / Claim (excluding Appeals and Advocacy) **

Level 1 Applications:

Travel Documents
Replacement Residence Permits

Cost - £500

Level 2 Applications:

Visit Visa
Naturalisation / Citizenship
EEA / EU residence and permanent residence

Cost - £800

Level 3 Applications:

Family reunion
Spouse / Partner / Civil / Unmarried partners of non – EU nationals

Dependent child visas
Student visas
Long residence in the UK

Cost - £1,000

Level 4 Applications:

Adult dependent relatives
Points based system applications

Cost - £1,500

Appeals

Completing and submitting an appeal form

Cost - £400

All Appeals – preparation of case (excluding advocacy)

Cost - £2,000

Counsel can be instructed upon request. Counsel's fees would need to be negotiated on an individual basis.

NB – We do not charge VAT

Disbursements

All disbursements will need to be paid for separately in addition to the fees for our services. Examples of disbursements include home office / visa application fees, court application fees, postage, interpreting / translation services, medical and expert report fees, mileage / travel; expenses. This is not an exhaustive list and is meant purely as a guide.

*Initial consultation fee will be deducted from the final bill (if the consultation is longer than the free 30 minutes) if we proceed to deal with your case;

** Applications for more than one individual will be charged at an extra 50% per application for each additional person;

What services are included

The work will involve:

- discussing your circumstances in detail and confirming whether this is the most appropriate application for you to make and what other options may be available to you;
- giving you advice about the requirements of the Immigration Rules and whether you meet the criteria.
- if you do not fulfil certain criteria, whether this can be overcome and how;
- considering the supporting evidence you have provided;
- where necessary, helping you obtain further evidence (such as medical records and bank statements), including taking statements of any witnesses;
- preparing your application and submitting it on your behalf;

- Attendance at a Home Office interview: if the Home Office ask you to attend an interview, we will give you clear advice (and discuss the possibility of us attending with you) at the appropriate time;
- giving you advice about the outcome of the application and any further steps you need to take.

How long will my application take?

We cannot guarantee how long the Home Office will take to process your application. [Read the current processing times.](#)

We will normally be able to submit this type of application within 3 weeks of you instructing us, but we will let you know at the earliest opportunity if it is likely to take longer than this.

Please note the fixed fees are an estimate based on the facts above. All applications are likely to vary and of course, we can give you a more accurate estimate once we have more information about your specific case.
